

Pastor Lisa's Letter

"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (John 1:5, NIV)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am writing just before Thanksgiving, and I want to take a moment to say "Thank You" to everyone who helped out with this year's Generosity Campaign. I am grateful for the many helpers who planned and worked to make the Campaign and the Generosity Sunday a success. It was so good to see so many folks in worship and at lunch on November 17. If you haven't had a chance to return your pledge card and/or service survey, please mail or bring them to the church office before the first of the year.

The verse above is one that I preached on in my Top Ten Favorite Scriptures sermon series. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. Winter is coming soon. Daylight Saving Time is over, and we're back to light as God intended it. Darkness comes early and the days are getting shorter.

I remember walking to Bible study one night in January when I was in college at Huntingdon. We had just had a rare snowfall, and my friends and I were commenting on the beauty of the campus with a dusting of snow. As we were walking past the dining hall, I spied a small rose bush, with one single rose in bloom. There in the dead of winter was a sign of the spring to come.

God brings new life to us in the dead of winter. This is the good news of Christmas. God comes to us as a human, Emmanuel, God with us, in the midst of our suffering, our grief, our pain. Light shines in darkness. God doesn't wait until humanity gets its collective act together to come to us. Instead, God meets us in our brokenness.

This year, we will be adding a new service to our Advent offerings. We will hold a Blue Christmas service on Dec. 22 at 4:00 p.m. in the sanctuary. Blue Christmas services are open to anyone who is grieving, depressed, lonely, or otherwise hurting during the holiday season. We come together in a safe space to acknowledge our pain and to remember the hope that we claim in Christ.

We have a full slate of activities this month as we prepare to welcome the Christ-child to be born again in our hearts the Christmas. We hope that you will plan to join us to bring meaning to this season of gifts and giving.

Being your pastor has been an incredible gift to me this year. I pray that all of you will have a blessed Christmas season.



What are your hobbies?





Generosity Witness

Good morning! This is the Day the Lord has made! Let us rejoice and give thanks in it! Amen! Our Conference bishop, Dr. Dolores Williamston, has requested we keep 3 action words in mind when we do ministry: Build, Connect and Equip. *That's Build, Connect and Equip*.

Let's start with Connect. My wife Marilyn and I moved to Slidell in 1980, in Biblical terms, that's a Generation ago. It is amazing how quickly a generation can pass when you belong to a loving church. We were invited to First Church by a coworker, that was Rick Rawle. Never underestimate the enduring quality to Connect.

The next action word is Build. One of our former Sr Pastors, Rev. Joe McClain, had this to say, "You can't be "Standing on the Promises", if you're sitting on the premises." There are many opportunities to be involved in church ministry, to Build our presence in Slidell. To Build generosity, Rev. Joe McClain shared this Sage Proverb: "Money, he said, is like horse manure, it's no good unless you spread it around! And if you work to pile it up, it soon begins to stink".

Spreading it around, is way more fun!

Our third action word is Equip.

One of the Sunday School teachers my girls had was Ms. Emily McGee. She was a retired elementary school teacher and established the 3rd Grade Bible Fund and faithfully added to it year after year. Give more, tax-free: Eligible IRA owners can donate up to \$105,000 to charity in 2024!

WASHINGTON — The Internal Revenue Service reminds individual retirement arrangement (IRA) owners age 70½ and older that they can make up to \$105,000 in tax-free charitable donations during 2024 through qualified charitable distributions. That's up from \$100,000 in past years. For those age 73 or older, qualified charitable distributions (QCDs) also count toward the year's required minimum distribution (RMD).


Generally, IRA distributions are taxable, but QCDs remain tax-free if sent directly to a qualified charity by the trustee. To make a QCD for 2024, IRA owners should contact their IRA trustee soon to ensure the transaction completes by year-end. Each eligible IRA owner can exclude up to \$105,000 in QCDs from taxable income. Married couples, if both meet qualifications and have separate IRAs, can donate up to \$210,000 combined. QCDs don't require itemizing deductions. For those planning ahead, starting this year, the QCD limit is subject to annual adjustment, based on inflation. For that reason, the annual QCD limit will rise to \$108,000 in 2025.

Reporting and documenting QCDs

For 2024, QCDs should be reported on the 2024 tax return. IRA trustees will issue Form 1099-R, Distributions From Pensions, Annuities, Retirement or Profit-Sharing Plans, IRAs, Insurance Contracts, etc., in early 2025 documenting IRA distributions. The full amount of any IRA distribution goes on Line 4a of Form 1040, U.S. Individual Income Tax Return, or Form 1040-SR, U.S. Tax Return for Seniors. Enter "o" on Line 4b if the full amount is a QCD, marking it as such.

Donors must obtain a written acknowledgement from the charity showing the contribution date, amount and confirmation that no goods or services were received.


