

PASTOR LISA'S LETTER

"Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable; it keeps no record of wrongs; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. . . . And now faith, hope, and love remain, these three, and the greatest of these is love." (1 Corinthians 13:4-7, 13; NRSV)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am writing on my first day back in the office after the great snowstorm of 2025! That was an amazing display of God's beauty and power. I've enjoyed seeing pictures of beautiful snow-covered scenery and families playing together out in the snow. Sometimes, what we really need is a break and a deep breath. I hope that all of you were safe and warm during the storm.

February is here and with it comes the celebration of Valentine's Day. Even if you don't have a sweetheart to celebrate with, the idea of taking a day and celebrating love itself is not a bad idea. Paul gives us the quintessential definition of love from a Christian perspective. In the quote above, Paul describes love as kind and patient and free from selfishness and self-seeking. Love is everlasting, far apart from any circumstances that might try to hinder it.

It's important to note here that while Valentine's Day in the US is generally associated strictly with romantic love, that is absolutely not what Paul was referring to. The Greek language in Paul's day had more than one word for love. *Phileo* referred to love between friends or brothers (think Philadelphia – city of brotherly love). *Eros* was the word for romantic love. Neither of these words are used by Paul in 1 Corinthians 13. Instead, the Greek word we translate as love in this passage is *agape*.

Agape love is sacrificial love. It is the love that allow a person to put their spouse or partner first sometimes. It is the love that allows a parent to stay up all night nursing a sick child. It is the love that binds us together as brothers and sisters in Christ. It is the love that kept Jesus on the cross for us. Agape isn't just a feeling, although it may be accompanied by feelings. Agape is a choice, to love courageously whether that love is returned or not. Agape is a conscious decision to extend love and grace to one another without considering the outcome or what is in it for us.

So much of our society is based on transactions – I'll scratch your back if you'll scratch mine. Paul, motivated by Christ and filled with the Holy Spirit, encourages us to set down our calculators, rulers, and measuring sticks. Paul calls us to love, to be patient, to be kind. After all, faith, hope, and love are all still with us. And the greatest of these is love.

I encourage you to take time this month to spread some *agape* love to others. Offer love, grace, and peace to a stranger. Show kindness to the driver who cuts you off in traffic. Forgive those who have wronged you. Remember that God loves you more than you can imagine. Share a little of that boundless love with your fellow children of God each day!





We delivered the 104 Cleaning Buckets and had a very informative and wonderful trip to Sager Brown UMCOR Depot in Baldwin, La. The warehouse had become depleted after the hurricanes this past summer and our delivery was met with open arms. Unfortunately, our buckets will probably be going to California to the Los Angeles area to the forest fires devastating that area.

Each year, more than 2,000 volunteers prepare approximately \$4 million in relief supplies for shipment from the UMCOR Sager Brown Depot in response to disasters in the United States. UMCOR Sager Brown Depot reaches out to its local neighbors through food distribution, housing rehabilitation projects and through other community outreach efforts.







The Senior Luncheon for February will be on Wednesday, February 12th to begin at 11:00 a.m. It would really be great if




everyone could be in attendance for 11:00. **Cost is \$8.00.**
